

12 FAH-8 H-740 OTHER U.S. GOVERNMENT AGENCIES UNDER COM AUTHORITY

The regulations and policies governing residential security cover U.S. citizen direct-hire employees of other U.S. Government agencies and their eligible family members who fall under COM authority.

12 FAH-8 H-742 OTHER U.S. GOVERNMENT AGENCY OPTIONS

(TL:RSP-01; 11-01-2001)

The heads of other U.S. Government agencies under COM authority may believe a different level of security for their employees and/or their eligible family members is required from that which is provided to all other U.S. citizen direct-hire employees. A request explaining the reasons for the different requirements, after consideration and approval by the RSO, the emergency action committee (EAC) and COM should be sent to DS/CIS/PSP/FPD for consideration and approval prior to changing the residential security provided to any U.S. citizen direct-hire employee. The principle of fair and equitable treatment will be applied to all requests. This principle may lead to the denial of a request even if funding is available.

12 FAH-8 H-743 FUNDING

(TL:RSP-01; 11-01-2001)

a. RSO required physical and technical residential security enhancements at residences occupied by the U.S. citizen direct-hire employees of other U.S. Government agencies are funded by DS/CIS/PSP/FPD.

b. When residential guard services are provided to other U.S. Government agency employees through the post's RSP, the costs of providing this protection are charged to the other U.S. Government agencies by the Department on a pro rata shared basis.

12 FAH-8 H-744 NATIONAL SECURITY DECISION DIRECTIVE (NSDD) 38 ACTIONS

(TL:RSP-01; 11-01-2001)

a. COM approval is required before any U.S. Government agency can add an additional position or positions at a mission. The process required to receive COM approval is known as an NSDD 38 approval. This is as a result of the Presidential decision that gave COMs control over the number of positions at their missions.

b. When a U.S. Government agency seeks to increase the number of positions which it maintains at a post, the agency is required to cover certain costs related to the new position. Some of the costs for which an agency is responsible are the start-up costs for any residential security enhancements required by the RSO and/or PSO for the dwelling occupied by the incumbent of the new position.

c. As part of the approval process for the addition of a new position at a post, the RSO and/or PSO may be required to provide a list of improvements and enhancements that would be required at any proposed residence. Although the RSO and/or PSO are not required to, they may assist in providing cost estimates for these improvements or enhancements.
