DePaul University students, consider carefully before you vote to ban Sabra brand hummus from your campus.

According to the Jewish United Fund/Jewish Federation of Metropolitan Chicago, a referendum asking students whether they want a replacement hummus brand served on campus is in fact part of an effort to eliminate Israel.

“As trivial as the determination of which kind of hummus to serve to students at a local university may seem, this campaign has serious ramifications,” said Michael C. Kotzin, the Jewish Federation’s executive vice president. “SJP is using misleading language to cloak their real intention in the guise of concern for human rights. In fact, their ultimate goal is the elimination of the State of Israel.”

The SJP — Students for Justice in Palestine — are behind the referendum, and they say Sabra’s parent company, the Strauss group, sends financial support to two Israeli military units accused of human rights abuses
